INSIDE TRACK LUNCHEON •

What We Need to Know About Our Water

 $F^{\rm ormer}$ GM and CEO of the LCRA, Tom Mason boasts a long list of qualifications that made him uniquely suited as the speaker for one of Headliners' Inside Track Lunches about the water plan for Texas.

He explained that most people in the world bounce between the fear of too little water (drought) and too much water (flood). Here in the Texas Hill Country we are known as "Flash Flood Alley" to meteorologists worldwide. Our dependence on the Lower Colorado River for our drinking water spurred the construction in 1893 of the original dam that forms Lake Austin. At the time it was the largest hydroelectric dam in the US. Since then it has been rebuilt more than once after flooding washed it away.

Texas has seen more than its share of drought as well. Currently the drought leaves our reservoirs that provide Austin with water less than 50% full. The severity of the drought just north of us is even more extreme, with two of their three water reservoirs for the upper part of the Colorado River less than 1% full.

The current water plan for Texas estimates that our population will double in the next 50 years. Mr. Mason highlighted five main elements of the plan that are meant to help meet the demand for water in our state. First is conservation - it is the fastest and cheapest way to make our supply of water stretch farther. The second is *reservoirs*, but these are very expensive to build and require compliance with private property laws and environmental Element number three laws. is ground water. Some aquifers recharge quickly, however some recharge very slowly and are being depleted as they are being used. Additionally, the regulations for ground water usage vary by district and are not regulated aquifer wide. Fourth on the water plan list is treated water - sewage that has been treated back to drinking quality water. The fifth element Mr. Mason highlighted is *desalination* for drinking water. The tremendous cost associated with desalination makes it a less appealing option.

As our population grows, our need for water grows. Our expectation for cheap, clean, accessible water might have to adapt – Mr. Mason suggests that we value water and appreciate it.
